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Executive Summary

Light of Life Trust, a non-governmental organization established in 2002 and registered under Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 is founded by Villy Doctor, with a vision to transform the lives of underprivileged rural communities.



Project Anando – Education:

Initiated in 2005 with 25 students of Karjat, Project Anando aims to support underprivileged rural children to complete their secondary education, as well as focusing on their all-round development. Over the years it has impacted **19451 children** and **1315** teachers directly and **184035** community members indirectly in the states of Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan & Odisha through its verticals – Anando, Anando Plus, Anando School Empowerment Programme & Anant Programme.

Anando: Initiated in 2005, the programme aims to ensure holistic development of rural underprivileged secondary school students thereby enhancing their academic abilities as well as build their all-round personalities and work towards completing their basic education through a 3E approach – Educate, Empower & Equip for Employability. The programme since inception has reached out to **19451** students directly and **145158** family & community members indirectly.

Anando Plus: Initiated in 2008 – 09, with an aim to reach out to Std. X Anando students and guide them towards achievement of the third E – Equip for Employability. Students are supported and guided in making appropriate career choices keeping in mind their interest, aptitude and capacities. Individually students are advised and motivated to follow a certain path that would lead to their progress and development.

Anant Programme: Initiated in 2008 the Anant Programme is a unique programme providing a platform for students to develop skills and experience in the performing arts. The major music components covered are Indian classical vocal (singing), folk and classical Indian Dance and Tabla. More than **1300** students have been a part of the Anant Programme since its inception.

Anando School Empowerment Programme: Initiated in June 2019, this programme is a combination of key activities from LOLT's flagship programme Anando & its teacher focused programme – the School Empowerment Programme. This programme envisages enhancing the quality of education being imparted in secondary schools and is looking at impacting not only the school teachers but the students and their parents in the effort to make a difference in the overall quality of education and life of all involved key stakeholders. The programme intends to strengthen the partnership of school authorities, parents and students towards the ultimate development of the students who are emerging responsible citizens of a young and dynamic India. In total through the programme **38877** students & **1315** teachers across **23** schools have been directly reached out to since inception.



Project Jagruti – Community Development:

Initiated in 2010 at Tiware, Karjat Taluka, it supports the holistic development of underprivileged rural communities and has reached out to more than **343238** beneficiaries and their families through its verticals – Livelihood & Skill Development, Healthcare & Environment Conservation across Raigad, Thane, Nandurbar, Akola & Mumbai Districts in Maharashtra State & Sikar District in Rajasthan State.

Livelihood Training Programme: Operational since 2010 this programme provides skill-based training to underprivileged women and youth to equip them to attain financial independence. **15495** people have directly benefitted through these trainings and interventions.

Healthcare: In operation since 2013, the LOLT MMU's reach out to remote areas without adequate health care facilities. Covering **114850** people across Raigad, Thane, Nandurbar, Ratnagiri & Pune Districts. (Karjat, Murbad, Akkalkuwa, Taloda, Ambegaon, Junnar and Rajgurunagar Tehsils)

Environment Conservation Programme: Initiated in 2015 this programme supports poor farmers in generating additional income by providing them with fruit bearing saplings. So far **6808** farmers from **201** villages have benefitted under this initiative.

Light of Life Trust has reached out to 548039 beneficiaries since its inception across the states of Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat & Odisha.

Major Highlights 2022 – 23

LOLT Reach:

Overall LOLT reached out to **50499** beneficiaries directly and **265098** indirectly across its projects Anando & Jagruti.

- **Project Anando** reached out to **12603** Students & **111** Teachers from **11** Districts across the states of Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh & Odisha through **69** Centres and **14** Schools impacting **75618** lives indirectly.
- Project Jagruti reached out to 37896 community members across three major programmes covering 5 districts in the state of Maharashtra & Rajasthan and impacted 189480 lives indirectly.

Sunhere Alfaaz II - LOLT's Musical Fundraiser - On 14th October 2022, Light of Life Trust successfully organized Sunhere Alfaaz II a musical event, celebrating the lyrics of the golden era by Sanjeevani Bhelande at Nehru Centre Auditorium, Worli, Mumbai. The auditorium was packed with 800 + well-wishers & supporters. Anant programme beneficiary students of Light of Life Trust also got an opportunity to present a song to the audience which received an overwhelming response.

Initiation of the Medical Mobile Unit, Dapoli:

On 22nd September 2022, Light of Life Trust in partnership with Lodha Ventures Foundation launched its new Medical Mobile Unit at Dapoli Village, Mahad Taluka, Ratnagiri District. The dignitaries from Lodha Ventures Foundation Ms. Stuti Ahluwalia & Mr. Dipendra Gupta along with Mr. Gautam Kanoje (Project Manager – Project Jagruti, Light of Life Trust), Mr. R. M. Dighe (Chief Guest Block Development Officer) and Mr. Kishore Jadhav (Taluka Medical Officer) and key village persons graced the event with their presence.

Initiation of Water Source Programme with Rajkamal Bajaj Foundation:

Thombarwadi village consisting of 45 households with a population of 250 people was selected under this programme. On 21st February 2023, in the presence of the villagers, the village development committee, Sarpanch, Mr. Pimperkar, other representatives of the Gram Panchayat, well construction contractors, electricians and plumbing work contractors and LOLT team were present. The work of constructing the well in the identified location was initiated.

On 27th July 2022, Light of Life Trust receives the award for its Project Anando - for creating an optimistic impact on society through its Project Anando in Maharashtra by Maharashtra CSR Summit.



Certificate of Appreciation from MKCL:

On 15th December 2022, Light of Life Trust's Livelihood & Skill Development Centers at Taloda, Nandurbar and Shivar, Akola were awarded the Certicate of Appreciation by the Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Limited (MKCL) by Ms. Veena Kamath, Managing Director, Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Limited (MKCL).This certication was received in honour of successfully mobilizing and conducting MKCL approved trainings for the benefiaries at the centres.

Initiation of the HP CLAP Programme:

The first of its kind in Maharashtra State in partnership with NT Assets Ltd & HP Clap (Continued Learning Access Programme), a mobile digital van was launched for the benefit of the school children in two schools under the ASEP programme in Karjat, Raigad District. This is an initiative by HP India to bridge the digital divide between communities. The programme targets students from slow-income strata with no digital devices to support their school lessons. Under this programme the van is equipped with 120 Chromebooks loaded with the state syllabus from Std I to X. The van was inaugurated on 04th August 2022 in the presence of representatives from HP India and LOLT Founder & Managing Trustee, Ms. Villy Doctor, Mr. Ramesh Daswani – CEO, LOLT and the schools students, teachers, principals & the LOLT Team.

Third Party Evaluation by Bajaj Finserv & SCCI Kraftsmala:

- Anando Plus Programme: Raigad (Karjat, Alibaug, Mangaon Tehsils), Jalna, Washim & Nandurbar Districts: The districts supported by Bajaj Finserv underwent an intense third party evaluation by Sattva appointed by the funding partner. The assessing team visited 04 regions and interacted with all the stakeholders in the programme. Two regions were covered online.
- **SCCI Kraftsmala** undertook a third party evaluation to understand the impact of the scholarships provided to 4 Anando Plus girl students in Nandurbar (03) and Alibaug (1).

Plant a Tree Campaign:

On 5th June World Environment Day, Light of Life Trust launched an initiative to plant 1000 trees in Tiware Village, Karjat, Tehsil, Raigad District through its 'PLANT A TREE' campaign. It would enable the donors to contribute towards any number of saplings they would like to plant. 1518 Avenue and Fruit bearing saplings were planted as per donor's choice at the end of this campaign. The inauguration function was undertaken in the presence of Mr. Ramesh Daswani, CEO and Ms. Kamal Damania, COO, LOLT and team members. The saplings have been planted at Tiware Centre, Karjat Tehsil, Raigad District.

Har Ghar Tiranga – Aazadi Ka Amrit Mahaotsav – 75th year of India's Independence:

Over 1000 Indian National Flags were distributed to beneficiary households in Karjat by the LOLT teams in alignment with the 'Har Ghar Tiranga – Aazadi Ka Amrit Mahaotsav' campaign of the Government of India ahead of the 75th Year of India's Independence celebration on 15th August 2022. To mark this momentous occasion LOLT's Anant Programme team also composed a mashup and released a song on India's 75th Independence.

Project Anando

First generation learners need support and guidance to break out of the vicious cycle of poverty and illiteracy.

Light of Life Trust through Project Anando, works towards uplifting underprivileged rural secondary school children by sustaining them in schools and equipping them with the necessary skills to become independent and productive citizens of society. The goal is not just literacy but all-round development of each child through a 3E approach, i.e. Educate, Empower & Equip for Employability, thereby empowering the students to embrace life changing decisions by choosing appropriate career paths.



3E APPROACH

Educate: Reinstate or sustain in schools, provide supplementary education, extra-curricular activities for holistic development.

Empower: Meditation, Personality development through imparting life skills.

Equip for Employability: Career guidance and planning, English language development and Computer training programmes.

Concentrating on his/her all-round development each child is given requisite support.

Objectives of the Anando Programme

- Enhancing the child's personality.
- Ensuring that students are suitably equipped for employability which will enable them to lead a life of dignity and self-sufficiency.
- Building capacity and quality to face up to and withstand competition and develop leadership skills.
- Involvement of parents, community and teachers in the child's growth and development.

Light of Life Trust, through Project Anando directly supports the secondary education of underprivileged children in rural communities of India through the following verticals:

Anando: Initiated in 2005, the programme through a 3E approach - 'Educate, Empower and Equip for Employability' supports secondary school children to realise their full potential through their academic as well as overall personality development. The Student Friendly Supplementary Education Programme (SFSEP) addresses the crucial needs of secondary school children in English and Mathematics through daily classes leading to conceptual clarity and strengthening of the children's capacity for better academic performance.

Anando Plus : In the academic year 2007 – 08, this special programme was launched to support Anando students post Std X (SSC) to make appropriate career choices based on their aptitude, capabilities and interest either to pursue higher education or undertake vocational training. Efforts are made to network with local educational institutes to give special considerations and/or generate financial support through scholarships for the needy children.

Anant : Initiated in 2008, Anant is a collaborative Arts Education programme between Flowering Tree Inc., USA and Light of Life Trust. It is a unique programme in song, dance, and story-telling that has empowered hundreds of children through training in instrumental and Indian vocal music, and folk and semi-classical dance. Anant provides opportunities and platforms to develop skills and experience in performing arts. Dedicated music and dance teachers, along with social workers, staff from a strong dual pronged team, that nurtures and guides Anant participants to overcome the challenges to their aspirations.

Anando School Empowerment Programme: Initiated in 2012, the programme aims to enhance quality of education imparted in rural secondary schools through training of teachers in effective classroom processes & modern teaching techniques and encourage active participation of all stakeholders including parents and community to ensure the existence of a cohesive support system for children to complete their basic education.

Major Highlights 2022 – 23

Anando Programme Reach:

- States: 4 (Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh & Odisha)
- Districts: 11 Tehsils: 30 Villages: 634 Centres: 69
- Direct Beneficiaries: 4508 Indirect Beneficiaries: 27048

Initiation of Quality Improvement of Education of Children in Government High Schools with a special focus on Girls through Remedial Coaching Classes:

In a one of its kind partnership with Nav Bharat Jagriti Kendra (NBJK) this programme was initiated in the month of August 2022 with 22 secondary schools in Karjat & Khalapur Tehsil, Raigad District covering 800 girl students through Remedial Coaching Classes in Science, Maths & English. The programme aimed to improve the overall performance of 800 secondary school girl children belonging to underprivileged families through 20 RCCs to curb the dropout rate amongst the girl children especially in the rural areas. Through the programme efforts were also made to motivate parents and the community towards girls education in order to avoid/delay early childhood marriage of girls. The programme looked at providing a better career & future to the rural children through improvement in class 10th, i.e., Board Exam Results which is the gateway of future for children. A number of non-scholastic activities were also undertaken with the participating students through drawing, essaywriting, debate competition, sports, quiz program, to ensure holistic development of the children and making learning joyful.

Hands on training for Science Teachers in collaboration with the Royal Society of Chemistry:

On 9th & 10th of November 2022, a two day training programme in science was conducted for the Light of Life Trust SFSEP teachers by Mr. Hemant Lagavnkar, Science Communicator, and Educational Consultant. The objective of the training was to clear the basic concepts in science and teaching innovative methods of delivery using live experiments. This training helped the teachers to utilize the learnings in the class which will benefit the students in gaining knowledge through live experiments and strengthen their basic concepts in the subject.

Digital Learning:

In this year 18 videos related to the syllabus for Std VIII – X were created by the SFSEP team and uploaded on the LOLT YouTube Channel:

youtube.com/c/lightoflifetrust

The content as well as the telecast was prepared by the SFSEP team which covered the syllabus of Maths for Marathi medium & English as per the prescribed State Board syllabus.

Digitalization of Classroom at Worli Center:

With support of the Dalamal Family for the first time a Smart Learning Board was installed to aid learning for the students at the Worli center. This will enable students to interact, engage and experience a whole new world of audio-visual learning and boost their knowledge.

Student Friendly Supplementary Education Programme:

In the year 2022 – 23 physical classes restarted across all regions post pandemic. SFSEP teachers positively dealt with the aftermath of COVID 19 on the students where attention spans had decreased, students were unable to sit for a long period of time in one place and unlearning of a number of concepts. The SFSEP teachers jointly worked on different techniques by which students could be brought back on track and be better prepared for the Std X exams. In this year the following number of sessions were held with

the children in the two subjects:
No. of English sessions: 22,059 English sessions with an average attendance of 72.41%.

- No. of Math sessions: 23,057 Math sessions with an average attendance of 72.19%.
- No. of Internal Tests: 1,811 with an average attendance of 72.66%.

Academically Shivam is an average student and is a confident child with a good sense of humour. In the SFSEP classes and in school, he was regularly

passing comments on other students disturbing the class and behaving rudely with the teacher and other classmates. His mother shared that Shivam also behaves rudely with family members and according to her he is copying his father who always behaves very rudely at home as Shivam always uses the same words and behaves in the same manner like his father. Shivam and his father were individually counselled over time and made to realize that if he considered education important and his dream crucial then he needed to change his behavior pattern. Both of them understood that they must change their behaviour. Ongoing follow up slowly and gradually, changed both their misbehaviours into positive behaviour. Shivam is also being motivated to focus on his studies and to participate in all extracurricular activities of the school.

Subhashree comes from a poor socioeconomic background. Her mother works in a Tailoring unit, shouldering all responsibilities as her father is an alcoholic causing disturbance on a daily basis due to his drinking habit. Initially her mother was not willing to send her to school or enrol her in the Anando programme but after continuous follow

up by the LOLT team she agreed. Subhashree is academically very poor and though she was able to write her name in Odia and English, she did not know any of the alphabets in Odia and English. She was attending the SFSEP classes regularly but was not participating in any activity nor speaking at all during the classes. The LOLT team gave her special attention, took extra classes over the year and she has responded well showing improvement in writing few words in Odia and English. She has also started participating in various workshop activities, does her homework and has begun to interact with other students in her class and with the SFSEP teacher. She is being continuously motivated and guided to ensure further development. Her mother is also happy to see her improvement and values the support being provided to her child.

Poonam lives with her mother and brother after her father passed away 10 years ago in an accident. The LOLT team observed that Poonam was fighting with her classmates every day and her aggressive nature was becoming an

obstacle to her development. Many counseling sessions were undertaken to convince her of the benefits of completing her education and to support her to redirect her focus towards her goals. The LOLT team started taking continuous follow up with her and her mother about her behavior and made Poonam realize that she was not doing the correct things in class and because of this behavior she would be spoiling her future. She was counselled in a friendly manner and was given due attention through regular follow up of her educational growth. Now Poonam is more stable and has started behaving well with her classmates. She has also started studying more regularly and is paying more attention during the SFSEP classes.

Vivek's father is uneducated and is an alcoholic with a bad liver. His mother went into depression after his father was diagnosed with liver failure and was unable to meet all the needs of the family and hence Vivek decided to take on this responsibility to support his mother and started working as a farm laborer. Due to this he became irregular in school as he

gave priority to earning for survival. The LOLT team undertook regular home visits as his absenteeism grew and tried to motivate his mother and younger brother to support his education but due to ignorance and poverty the family was not willing. During the lockdown as it was difficult to work continuously with him the LOLT team took the support of the parent representative to support him for the education. His maternal uncle too came forward to help him. After continuous work with his mother and younger brother the family became more positive about sending him regularly for all LOLT activities. He was also counselled individually to enhance his academic performance and understand the importance of education.

Major Highlights 2022 – 23

Expansion of Anando Plus Programme:

With support from a corporate house (name withheld on request) LOLT was able to extend the Anando Plus programme in new regions in Maharashtra (Districts: Yawatmal, Ahemadnagar, Nandurbar – Dhadgaon), Rajasthan (Districts: Bhilwara & Bundi) and Madhya Pradesh (District: Seoni) in this year 2022 – 23 covering 948 students.

Third Party Evaluations of the Anando Plus Programme: In this year two partner organizations undertook third party evaluation of the programme as under:

- Raigad (Karjat, Alibaug, Mangaon Tehsils), Jalna, Washim & Nandurbar District: The regions supported by Bajaj Finserv underwent an intense third party evaluation by Sattva appointed by Bajaj Finserv. The assessing team visited Karjat, Alibaug, Jalna & Washim from 25th January to 05th February, 2023. The team carried on indepth discussions with students and parents through FGDs, individual conferences and home visits. In total 370 Anando Plus students were covered for sample survey and 14 FGDs were undertaken with the parents and students. Nandurbar and Mangaon were covered through online interviews. The assessing team also conducted online interviews with educational institutes and other agencies that LOLT has networked with whilst working under this programme.
- SCCI Kraftsmala: In total 04 girl students in Anando Plus (Nandurbar: 03 ; Alibaug: 1) were awarded scholarships by the organization. Through an independent evaluator, Ms. Utkarsha Rajepandhare, a third party evaluation was undertaken to gauge the impact of the scholarship provided by SCCI Kraftsmala on 23rd to 25th March, 2023. The evaluator undertook home visits, individual conferences and parent interviews of all the 04 girls and submitted the report to SCCI Kraftsmala.

Task Force Training Programme:

Post the pandemic this was the 1st year in which task force trainings were conducted across all regions physically. In total 572 students participated in the trainings held at the regional level. New members were inducted into the task force and oriented about the vision behind the task force formation and its objectives. Residential training were organized in Karjat, Alibaug and Mangaon regions resulting in a good bonding among the task force team members.

Post the training 350 students undertook various social awareness programmes reaching out to more than 1094 community members as under:

- Health Checkup camps in Karjat and Alibaug: 135.
- Career Guidance Programme in Karjat, Washim, Alibaug & Mangaon: 177.

- Awareness programmes in Karjat, Washim, Alibaug & Mangaon: 363.
- Tree Plantation Drive in Khalapur & Karjat: 37.
- Personality Development Workshops in Karjat, Alibaug & Mangaon: 260.
- Aadhar Card Updating Camp in Yavatmal: 102.
- Academic Support Classes in Mangaon: 20.
- Submission of application to Bus Depot to initiate much required bus service from Belora to Digras in Yawatmal District.

Anando School Empowerment Programme



Initiated in 2013, the programme aims to enhance the guality of education imparted in rural secondary schools through training of teachers in order to increase their engagement with children, equipping them with new tools and techniques, preparing them to mobilize parents & students to strengthen the partnership in order to ensure the overall development of the children.

In 2019 the Anando School Empowerment Programme - a combination of key activities from LOLT's flagship programme Anando & its teacher focussed programme - the School Empowerment Programme was initiated in Karjat Tehsil with two schools. The programme was replicated in 2021 in two schools in Pen Tehsil, Raigad District and an additional school in Kariat Tehsil. In 2022 – 23 the ASEP programme was extended to 3 schools in Chandrapur Tehsil and additional two school in Karjat & Khalapur Tehsil, Raigad District.

In total through the Anando School Empowerment Programme, LOLT has impacted 111 teachers & 2326 children across 14 schools in this year 2022 - 23.

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Major Highlights 2022 – 23

New Schools under the programme

- Karjat & Khalapur Tehsil, Raigad District: ASEP was initiated in the Janata Vidyalaya, Lowjee and the Lokmanya Tilak Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Vasrang.
- Ghugus, Chandrapur Tehsil & District: ASEP was initiated in the Priyadarshini Kanya Vidyalaya, New English High School and the Indira Gandhi Vidyalaya.

Initiation of the HP Clap Programme in two ASEP schools:

The first of its kind in Maharashtra State in partnership with NT Assets Ltd & HP Clap (Continued Learning Access Programme), a mobile digital van was launched for the benefit of the school children in two schools under the ASEP programme in Karjat Taluka, Raigad District. It is an initiative by HP India to bridge the digital divide between communities. The programme targets students from low-income strata with no digital devices to support their school lessons. Under this programme the van is equipped with 120 Chromebooks loaded with the state syllabus. The van was inaugurated on 04th August 2022 in the presence of representatives from HP India and LOLT Founder & Managing Trustee, Ms. Villy Doctor, Mr. Ramesh Daswani – CEO, LOLT, the schools students, teachers, principals & the LOLT Team.

Special Sessions organized for the ASEP school students:

• Session on Cyber Crime:

This session was conducted with 76 students from Std VII to X at the Lokmanya Tilak Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Vasrang. The session created an awareness amongst the students about the care one needs to take whilst using any electronic device and be careful about its side effects. The session was held at the Lokmanya Tilak Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Vasrang, under the guidance of Senior Police Inspector Mr. Shirish Pawar of Khopoli Police Station. Assistant Police Inspector Mr. Haresh Kalsekar interacted with the children. School Principal, teachers, and non-teaching staff were also present for this session.

• Session on Sex Education:

Sex education is a widely neglected at the school level despite it being an important component in a students life. This session was held for 65 students of Janata Vidyalaya, Lowjee in the presence of 04 school teachers by Dr. Subhash Katkadaund for the boys and Dr. Reshma Ranadive for the girls. The aim was to ensure students understand the importance of sex education at the right time as it would enable them to change their attitude towards sex as school students move towards adulthood.



School teachers training:

One of the most crucial aspects of the ASEP programme, the empowerment of the school teachers through experiential learning during interactive teachers training workshops held in the academic year by the LOLT ASEP team. In total 92 teachers participated in 19 teacher training sessions conducted across 11 schools in this year. Some primary school teachers also participated in these trainings. The sessions covered topics like Self & School SWOT Analysis, Child Psychology, Classroom management Vs. Classroom controlling, time management, decision making, and more. The results have been evident in the positive changes that teachers are making in their personal and professional lives.

Parent Involvement & Participation:

The ASEP programme has positively impacted parents participation & involvement in their child's life as well as at the school level. The Parents Teacher Association and School Management Committee have been activated in almost all the schools under the ASEP programme and they are working with the school authorities in harmony to make available facilities and to jointly find solutions in a timely manner with an emphasis on school development.

Student participation in the two day residential Yusuf Hamied Chemistry camp held at IIT, Powai, Mumbai in collaboration with the Royal Society of Chemistry and IIT Mumbai : This residential camp was held from 6th to 8th December 2022 in which 07 students under the ASEP programme participated where they received excellent exposure to practical and other science related knowledge. The students considered themselves privileged to have been given this opportunity to visit the IIT, Powai campus and interact with teachers par excellence in Chemistry.

New English School, Johe: Construction of sanitation facility by the School Management

The school is located in Pen Tehsil, Raigad District and reaches out to over 1700 students from Std V to XII. Students from 15 - 20 villages belonging to the families from lower economic strata attend this school. Since the last 5 years the school did not have proper sanitation facility which was a cause of great discomfort specially for the female students and teachers. The ASEP team regularly discussed and took follow up with the school Head Master and the School Management Committee Chairman and created awareness about their responsibility towards the students. The school authorities realised the need of constructing sanitation facilities and took the initiative to collect donations for new construction by reaching out to like-minded people for financial support. Finally the construction work of the sanitation facility commenced with the demolishment of the old broken down building.

Highlights 2022 – 23

Freelancer Training Course:

05 beneficiaries undertook this course and out of these 04 beneficiaries have secured employment at an average remuneration of \gtrless 12000/- per month.

Networking with companies & other training institutions at the local level:

The LOLT placement team has forged alliances with various agencies as under:

- Kshitij Foundation, Pen: MOU signed for implementing training courses for rural women.
- Shantarambhau Gholap Arts, Science and Gotirambhau Pawar Commerce College, Shivle: partnership for computer training programme.
- Institute of Rojgary and Skillskonnect Global Pvt. Ltd.: As placement agency, Mumbai.
- Anudeep Foundation: CSR collaboration activity.
- **Collaboration with Companies/Institute:** HR departments of 19 different companies have been collaborated with, for placement possibilities.

Session on preparing mindset of the beneficiaries to employment:

The problem of employment in rural areas is further heightened by the scarcity of employment opportunities along with the indifferent mentality of the beneficiaries. Even though the beneficiary is from an underprivileged background, they are not aware about employment and its demands. The LOLT team worked with the beneficiaries to make them clearly understand what it means to be employed or self employed and motivated them to start thinking appropriately to emerge successful. The team also undertook home visits wherever necessary to ease the discomfort of the family members. In total 1437 beneficiaries were counselled through these sessions in this year.

Job placement process & students follow-up :

- The LOLT team successfully created the thought processes of the beneficiaries for employment either in or outside their villages.
- WhatsApp groups were created region wise & course wise through which the LOLT team shared all job-related solutions & opportunities that came up.
- Interview preparation trainings were also given to some of the beneficiaries.
- · Professional guidance was given to beautician

course beneficiaries by arranging guest sessions.

 HR of various companies in Badlapur, Ambernath & Murbad MIDC have been networked with for employment opportunities.

Entrepreneur session with beneficiaries:

Along with each training course, in each center 04 different types of motivational & employment awareness sessions were organized in this year. Physical sessions were conducted by the Placement Officer in Karjat Tehsil and online sessions were conducted for other regions. In total 82 sessions were conducted throughout this year across all the Livelihood & Skill Development Centre.

Production Unit & Marketing:

- In total the Production Unit participated in 07 product exhibition stalls. The sale of products was ₹ 22,000/in this year.
- LOLT products were on display at the Jhappi Store, Thane and ₹ 2,800/- worth of products made by LOLT women through the production units was sold at the shop in this reporting year.

Karjat Tehsil, Raigad District (Tiware, Kashele, Kadav Centers)

Reach:

In total five training courses were undertaken in the year 2022 – 23 covering 981 beneficiaries from 98 villages across the Livelihood & Skill Development Centres in Tiware, Kadav, & Kashele Centres.

Ahluwalia, Proprietor and Training head of APTI in M.SC MAESL, Dr. Vivek G Mendonsa, Group Director, Marketing at LYNX – Lawrence & Mayo, LYNX - Lawrence & Mayo Drone Training Academy visited Tiware Centre as a step towards setting up a drone academy with LOLT in Karjat Tehsil.
- On 3rd March 2023, Dr. Swati S. Mujumdar, Principal Director - Symbiosis Open Education Society, Director -Symbiosis Centre for Distance Learning, Pro Chancellor - Symbiosis Skills Universities (Pune and Indore) along with her team and Dr. Vivek G Mendonsa, Group Director, Marketing at LYNX – Lawrence & Mayo, visited Tiware Centre and interacted with LOLT beneficiaries and Team.

 On 3rd March 2023, Mr. Sumeet Lal (COO- Kotak Education Foundation), Mr. Jesiel Kiny (Manager Training - Kotak Education Foundation), Ms. Priyanka Raj (Corporate Networking - Kotak Education Foundation) and Ms. Lavina D'sa (Cluster Head - Kotak Education Foundation) visited Tiware Centre to understand the work undertaken by LOLT and looked at initiating training courses in partnership with LOLT.

International Women's Day:

On the occasion of International Women's Day the LOLT team organised a special session for the women of the training courses on Motivation. Various activities and games were conducted ensuring the women enjoyed the day and felt renewed energy, inspiration and enthusiasm.

Murbad Tehsil, Thane District:

Reach:

The Livelihood & Skill Development Centre run in partnership with Rallis India Ltd, reached out to 417 beneficiaries through the various training courses offered at the centre. New course in Bamboo Art was introduced at the centre in this year.

Rallis India Ltd Volunteer Week:

In the month of October 2022, two activities were undertaken by Rallis India Ltd employee volunteers at the Centre as under:

- Session on Purse Making: 18 participants.
- Session on Diya Painting: 35 participants.

Satellite Batches:

These batches give an opportunity to beneficiaries from those villages who are far away from the existing centers and are unable to enrol due to long distances and lack of transportation facilities. Sewing & Tailoring, Beautician and Bamboo training batches were organized in different villages as under:

- Sewing & Tailoring batch at Jambhurde Village: 15 women.
- Sewing & Tailoring batch at Dhongarnave Village: 33 women.
- Beautician batch at Agashi Village: 22 women.

Women's Day celebration:

In the second consecutive year Women's Day was celebrated in Murbad Tehsil. Rangoli competition, Tailoring product competition, Computerised painting competition, various one-minute games, Quiz contest, and a Beauty Contest was held for the participating 160 women. A special recognition & felicitation programme was also held for the 49 successful women who had been guided to start their own small scale business ventures post skill-based training at the Dhasai Centre.

Proud Moment for Light of Life Trust:

On 30th December 2022, Sewing and Tailoring

beneficiaries of Jamburde Village received mobile stalls under 'Swayam Rojgar Vikri Kendra' scheme implemented by the Women and Child Department, Thane for Self – Employment Groups. All the women beneficiaries have started a small tailoring unit in the stalls.

Production Unit :

94 petticoats were stitched and school uniform orders were completed by the 11 women members of the production business group set up in Murbad.

Akola Tehsil, Akola District:

Reach:

The Livelihood & Skill Development Centre run in partnership with Rallis India Ltd, reached out to 501 beneficiaries across 35 villages through the Sewing & Tailoring, Beautician, Computer Training, Mobile Repairing and Bike Repairing courses. In this year the Bike Repairing & Mobile Repairing courses were introduced at the centre.

Satellite Batches:

LOLT organized satellite batches giving opportunities to those villages who were not able to connect to the existing centre due to long distance and lack of transportation facilities. Accordingly batches were organized in different villages as under:

- Sewing & Tailoring course at Kumbhari Village: 35 women.
- Sewing & Tailoring course at Guddhi Village: 14 women.
- Beautician course at Guddhi Village : 15 women.
- Sewing & Tailoring course at Chakardhar colony, Krushi Nagar: 20 women.

Women's Day Celebration:

Women's Day was celebrated in a grand manner for the 1st time at Shivar Center, Akola. Rangoli Competition, Tailoring Product competition, Computerised painting competition, various one-minute games and a Beauty Contest was held for 180 women beneficiaries. A special recognition & felicitation programme was also held for the 35 successful women who had been guided to start their own small scale business venture post skill-based training at the centre.

Soft Toy Making Training:

The LOLT Team established a good network with Shree Toys Ltd. MIDC, Shivar. Basic training and guidance was provided by the LOLT tailoring teacher to 06 women beneficiaries who are now employed at the same factory earning a monthly income of \gtrless 6,000/- per month.

Exposure visit:

The LOLT beneficiaries & team undertook an exposure visit to Sangha Textile at Borgaon Manju village. In total 15 women visited the factory and got a significant exposure to tailoring related product making work. Production Unit: Tailoring Women's Business Group's efforts:

- School Uniforms: 442 order of school uniforms was completed in this year by 30 women trained at the centre.
- Varkari Shabnam bags making order: Completed order of 500 bags.
- Indian Flag stitching order: On occasion of Independence Day: 1200 flags were stitched by the women earning ₹ 1200/- from this order.

Taloda Tehsil, Nandurbar District

Reach:

The Livelihood Training Centre in Taloda reached out to 296 beneficiaries across 57 villages in this year through the Sewing & Tailoring, Beautician, & Computer Training courses.

Initiation of MKCL MSCIT Centre in Borad village:

MKCL approved computer centre was initiated in this year at Borad Village – which is the main hub in the area.

Celebration of Women's Day:

Women's Day was celebrated at the Taloda Centre on 8th March 2023 with the distribution of Sewing & Beauty Parlour Kits and distribution of certificates to 99 beneficiaries. The event was graced by Ms. Leena Vani, Professor, Mahatma Phule College of Social Work.

Formation of Self Help Groups:

As a strategy to promote entrepreneurship amongst the students, SHGs were formed by students of the beautician course and the sewing & tailoring course. 80 women have come together through 10 self help groups in this year.

Production Unit:

LOLT tailoring unit worked on completion of 1024 school uniforms. 20 women are part of this tailoring unit.

Cuffe Parade, Mumbai District:

Reach:

The Livelihood & Skill Development Centre in Cuffe Parade reached out to 97 beneficiaries through the Sewing & Tailoring and Beautician courses. Most of the beneficiaries came from the Ambedkar Nagar slum community in Cuffe Parade, Mumbai.

Personality Development workshops with beneficiaries:

These workshops were undertaken with the beneficiaries of the training courses on a regular basis. The workshops helped them to understand their own strengths, weaknesses, skills and areas of improvement. The objective of the workshop was to give a space and opportunity to the beneficiaries to think about self-behavior, skills, attitude, values and approach towards self and with others such as family members, friends and others.

Women's Day Celebration:

Women's Day celebration programme started with a discussion on the importance of the day in the lives of women and ended with fun games and distribution of small gifts to all the participants.

Yoga Class:

A two month long yoga class was conducted for 15 beneficiaries who found it very beneficial.

Distribution of Set up Kits:

With support from the Inner Wheel Club of Bombay Pier, on 21st March 2023 two set up kits each for Sewing & Tailoring and Beautician courses were provided to the selected beneficiaries. Celebration of Special Health Marker Days:

- **Celebration of World ORS Week:** The Medical Mobile Units in Karjat & Murbad, celebrated the World ORS Week on 27th & 28th of July 2022. Awareness sessions were conducted in 06 villages covering 311 beneficiaries on the benefits of using ORS during Diarrhoea & Dehydration.
- World Health Day celebration: On 7th June 2022 World Health Day was celebrated by the Medical Mobile Unit, Karjat. An awareness session on COVID - 19 vaccination was undertaken with the new batch of beneficiaries from the Sewing & Tailoring course of the livelihood training centre at Kashele village, Karjat Tehsil.

 Initiative on World Sight Day: On 11th October 2022, Light of Life Trust's Medical Mobile Unit (MMU) teams in Murbad Tehsil & Karjat Tehsil, in collaboration with, Isha Netralaya & Nair Super Speciality Eye Hospital, New Panvel respectively organized an online session on 'Eye Disease & Health' by Dr. Santosh Kumar Nair, Medical Director, and Mrs. Priyanka Raorane, Faculty and Senior Optometrist from Nair Super Speciality Eye Hospital, New Panvel for 450 beneficiaries across 7 schools in Karjat Taluka.

Awareness sessions in collaboration with Zonta Club of Bombay 1 & Zonta Club of Dresden:

On 27th August 2022, Light of Life Trust in collaboration with Zonta Club of Bombay 1 & Zonta Club of Dresden conducted an awareness session on Menstrual Cycle & Menstrual Hygiene followed by a session on the impact of early girl child marriage in the life of the girls. At the end of the awareness session 189 sanitary kits were distributed to young girl & women from Ambot village, Karjat Tehsil, Raigad District. | Kailash Balu Katkari Newaliwadi, Karjat | Trauma to eye



Kailash lives with his parents & infant sister. During Diwali Kailash, while playing with fire crackers injured his right eye leading to inflammation of the eye. His parents took him to the government hospital where he was provided with eye drops & was referred to another doctor.

Since Kailash's father was an alcoholic & his mother had given birth to a baby, there was no income in the family and fearing a huge doctor's fee they did not take him to the referred doctor. A few days later Kailash attended the LOLT Medical Mobile Unit's Camp in collaboration with Nair Super Specialty Eye Hospital, New Mumbai. He was continuously crying & was very uncomfortable whilst he was being examined. His father was adamant not to take him to the hospital and the medical social worker had to counsel him regarding the need of treatment & its urgency. His father despite all support was so stubborn that midway he tried to run away. Fortunately his mother showed willingness and the family finally reached Raigad Hospital where he was examined and treated with drops & removal of the debris in his eyes. This timely intervention prevented a loss of vision in Kailash.

Kharshet, Murbad Ulcers in the mouth



Ms. Aditi, a Std IV student of Zilla Parishad School, Kharshet village was checked while conducting the health camp in her school. Aditi stays with her two sisters, her parents, her father's aunt & grandmother. Aditi's father is a security guard & her mother is an anganwadi sevikas. She had a

blister on her lip since the last few days & was having difficulty while eating. She was provided with primary treatment & was referred to the rural hospital for further treatment. She was afraid of going to the hospital & her parents also neglected her condition. She was counselled by the MMU team & made to visit the rural hospital in Tokawade village. She was provided with antibiotics & local application. She is now relieved of the painful blister & the discomfort she had been facing for so long.

She underwent Lt. eye cataract surgery free of cost and after the operation, medicines (eye drops) & spectacles were provided to her. The patient is now able to see with her left eye & has thanked the team for all the efforts to make her life better than before.

Highlights 2022 - 23

Environment Conservation Programme with support of All Cargo Logistics Ltd.:

In this year 600 new farmers across 24 villages were distributed 25500 fruit bearing saplings under the Environment Conservation Programme.

Plant a TREE campaign – World Environment Day:

On 5th June World Environment Day, Light of Life Trust launched the initiative to plant 1000 trees in Tiware Village, Karjat Tehsil, Raigad District. The campaign 'PLANT A TREE' would enable the donors to contribute towards any number of saplings they would like to plant. 1518 Avenue and Fruit bearing saplings were planted as per donor's choice at the end of this campaign. The inauguration function was undertaken in the presence of Mr. Ramesh Daswani, CEO and Ms. Kamal Damania, COO, LOLT and LOLT team members. The saplings have been planted at Tiware Centre, Karjat Tehsil, Raigad District.

Initiation of the Water Source Programme: (Construction of water well) under Project Jagruti in partnership with the Rajkamal Bajaj Foundation at Thombarwadi Village, Karjat Tehsil, Raigad District, Maharashtra State:

The foundation stone was laid on 21st February 2023 in presence of village committee members, village Sarpanch, Mr. Pimperkar, and the villagers. This village of 45 households had no access to water. Water was fetched from a well atleast 02 kms away from the village. This special project will ensure that the well will bring water to their doorstep and save villagers from walking 02 kms sometimes twice or thrice in a day for water. Women will be able to save a lot of time and energy which will be utilised for other purposes and free them for looking at earning sources which they have been denied over so many years.

Water Wheel Distribution Programme:

In this year a total of 134 water wheels were distributed by the LOLT team supported by:

• Billabong High International School:

On 1st December 2022, a water wheel distribution programme was held at Tiware Centre, Karjat Tehsil in collaboration with the Billabong High International School where 28 water wheels were distributed to the beneficiaries from Koshanewadi, Karjat Tehsil. Mr. Richard Cambridge along with four students from Billabong High International School were present for the programme along with the LOLT Jagruti team.



• Morning Star:

06 water wheels were distributed at Tiware Centre in the presence of dignitaries from Morning Star.

• Rotary Club of Bombay Hanging Garden and RR Pokhran Cable Group:

100 water wheels were distributed in the presence of President Mr. Navneet Ajmer, Honorable Mr. Amrish Daftari, Mr. Digat Shah, Mrs. Mehta and 12 Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Bombay Hanging Gardens and Mr. Rajesh Khabra, CMD of RR Pokhran Company.

Village Representative Committees:

In total 24 new Village Representative Committees were formed during this year. This 03 member committee at the village would guide the farmers in the village about plant survival and be the intermediary between villagers and LOLT.

Follow up with Farmers plot:

4568 farmers across 201 villages were followed up with regarding the status of the plants distributed to them. Follow-up regarding status of Mango and Guava plants was also done as they had reached flowering stage in this year.

Plantation activity at Tiware Centre by the students and teachers of The Cathedral & John Connon School, Mumbai:

On 19th November 2022, sixty-three students and three teachers from The Cathedral & John Connon School, Mumbai visited LOLT's Tiware Centre, Karjat Tehsil and planted 55 saplings which included 40 saplings of different coloured roses and 15 different varieties of indoor plants.

Media Coverage:

- Environment Conservation Programme plant distribution activity was highlighted in more than 12 regional newspapers this year.
- **Collector of Raigad District** took notice of the plantation of Light of Life Trust and posted the news on personal Facebook page.

Pintu planted 50 fruit bearing saplings around his house and in his yard. He lives with his wife and two small children. He and his family water the saplings on a daily basis and the trees are growing properly. He has come up with a new idea from his own experience. A large number of

stones around the tree increases water retention capacity of the tree and the rate of water evaporation is very less. He has placed stones at all the tree trunks and as a result, all plants are alive and thriving. Since this is the first year of planting the trees he needs to nurture them for the next two years post which they will bear fruit and show results. In order to sustain he also runs a business of selling dried fish earning enough money to sustain. But after these trees start bearing fruit his income will start doubling.

Name of the Beneficiary | Sakharam Baliram Hilam Age 52 years Village & Tehsil | Mirchulwadi, Karjat Year of plantation 2022



Sakharam a 65 year old farmer works as a social worker for the Tribal (Katkari) community. He was selected as a farmer in 2022. After proper trainings & follow up he started digging pits in his own place filled it with organic fertilizers such as dry leaf, cow dung etc and then planted the trees. He diligently watered and nurtured the saplings.

He was also distributed water wheel to help him in nurturing his plants. He also cultivates vegetables in a small space to meet the expenses of his household. He sells the prepared vegetables int the market. In this way, he has come forward as a good farmer and he guides others and shares his experience and good practices with others.

Name of the Beneficiary | Malu Bhau Mengal Aae Village & Tehsil Year of plantation

54 years Damsewadi, Karjat | 2019



Malu is a very hardworking farmer from Damsewadi village. He was selected as a farmer in 2019 and given 50 fruits bearing saplings which he planted and nurtured in an excellent manner. He was also given a waterwheel as he had to physically carry water from the closest water well which was 2.5 kms and his entire family helped him water the

trees, keeping all 50 trees alive. Under guidance from the LOLT team he built a small hut amidst his mango plants and started rearing chicken birds (Gavathi) and growing cowpea vegetables in the summer. The most important thing is that he grows all the spices needed for his house himself. In this year his mango trees yielded 13 dozen mangoes of which he was able to earn ₹ 2600/-.

Name of the Beneficiary | Ganapat Lakshman Kamadi 48 years Aae Village & Tehsil Kotawalwadi, Karjat Year of plantation 2018



Ganpat is a very hardworking farmer from Kotwalwadi. During the rainy season he yields paddy. He was selected in 2018 and given 50 fruit bearing saplings to enable him to earn an additional source of income besides rice. He and his wife nurtured the plants by giving them water

regularly. To ease his burden of carrying water he was also provided with a water wheel. Even during the lockdown, he kept his trees alive by nurturing them closely. During this time, he also bought 50 additional mango trees with his own efforts and planted them. As he had the space he also started cultivating vegetables like bitter gourd, ridge gourd and cucumber and began to earn an average income of ₹ 70,000/- to ₹ 80,000/- per annum. His mangoes will start giving yield from the month of May 2023.


















